

# “Armenian Kesaria and Cappadocia”

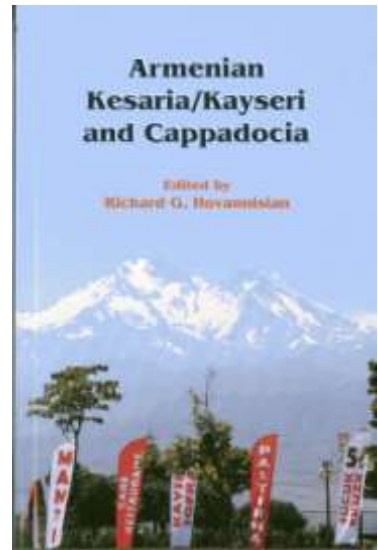
An Illustrated Lecture by

In this illustrated lecture, Prof. Hovannisian will discuss the history, religion, economic and social life, and cultural, educational, and political developments among the Armenians in the city of Kesaria (Gesaria) and its many outlying villages, such as Talas, Everek, Fenesse, Tomarza, Chomakhlu, Injesu, Efkere, and Germir. He will also show video segments of the last Armenians of Dikranagerd and the Armenian-Speaking Hamshens of the Black Sea. Hovannisian is the editor of the recently published *Armenian Kesaria and Cappadocia*, the 12th volume of proceedings from the UCLA conference series, “Historic Armenian Cities and Provinces.”

Hovannisian is the author of *Armenia on the Road to Independence*, the four-volume history, *The Republic of Armenia*, and has edited and contributed to more than 25 books including *The Armenian Genocide in Perspective*; *The Armenian People from Ancient to Modern Times*; *Remembrance and Denial*; *Looking Backward, Moving Forward*, and *The Armenian Genocide: Cultural and Ethical Legacies*. He is professor emeritus of Armenian and Near Eastern History at UCLA and is currently the chancellor fellow in the Department of History and the Rodgers Center for Holocaust Education at Chapman University in Orange, California.
